Applications now open for the Preserve, Promote and Protect our Aboriginal Sites Grants Program

Incorporated not-for-profit Aboriginal organisations are encouraged to apply for grants of up to \$50,000 (exclusive of GST) to support the protection, preservation and promotion of registered Aboriginal heritage sites.

Grants are available for physical on-the-ground works such as installing fences or signage, removing graffiti, site clean-up and remediation of sites.

Applications close Friday 29 March 2024

Applications will be assessed against the following criteria:

- Sustainable long-term heritage benefits
- Public benefit and increased awareness of Aboriginal heritage
- Opportunities and benefits for Aboriginal people and organisations
- Primary use of funding for physical works
- Meeting eligibility guidelines.

To apply, ensure that you:

- Submit applications via email by Friday 29 March 2024
- Check that the Aboriginal heritage site is on the Register using the <u>Aboriginal Cultural</u> <u>Heritage Inquiry System</u>
- Attach written evidence of support from landowners or leaseholders, and relevant Aboriginal community organisations and Native Title Prescribed Bodies Corporate.

Before you submit your application, we highly recommend that you discuss your project with the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage's Grants Team or Regional Office.
